### 10. Introduction of Guest Speaker, Dr. Ryan McLane – Paul Mason

Dr. McLane has worked all over the world in positions related to policy and management of health crises, including:

- managing a public health unit in the Alaskan arctic;
- leading a clinical team in an Ebola Treatment Unit in Sierra Leone;
- leading international response teams following disasters;
- and providing direct care for populations as diverse as indigenous Siberians, undocumented agricultural workers in California, and civilians caught in civil conflict in Guatemala.

During his ten years in New Zealand he has worked with:

- the Southern DHB,
- the Ministry of Health's Communicable Disease Team,
- and the University of Otago Medical School.

Dr McLane gave a thought-provoking and informative talk on his time in Chengdu, China, giving his audience an insight into a land and culture not seen by most tourists.

The audience engaged enthusiastically with him and several questions were discussed.

The evening closed with a waiata sung by the Featherston Wahine Singers, followed by a karakia by Dick Smith.
